Residential building approvals

In December 2022, the number of residential building approvals in the Territory decreased by 9.8% to 46, the weakest result of the jurisdictions, which otherwise ranged from a decrease of 3.3% in Western Australia and Tasmania to an increase of 13.3% in the Australian Capital Territory. Nationally, residential building approvals decreased by 0.4%.

In annual terms, the number of residential building approvals in the Territory increased by 15.0%. This was the only increase of the jurisdictions, which otherwise ranged from a decrease of 23.0% in Western Australia to a decrease of 0.5% in Victoria. Nationally, residential building approvals decreased by 6.6%.

In the year to December 2022, residential building approvals in the Territory increased by 5.2% to 671, compared with a decrease of 17.2% to 188,896 nationally (Chart 1). The Territory reported the only increase of the jurisdictions, which otherwise ranged from a decrease of 36.4% in Western Australia to a decrease of 4.6% in the Australian Capital Territory (Chart 2). Alterations, additions and conversions approvals increased by 711.1% from 9 to 73, unit and townhouse approvals increased by 96.4%, and house approvals decreased by 14.6%.


In the year to December 2022, the value of residential building approvals in the Territory decreased by 0.3% to \$373.8 million, compared with a decrease of 3.0% to \$89.0 billion nationally.


In December 2022, the value of non-residential building approvals in the Territory increased by 531.4% to \$126.8 million, reflecting an increase of 2647.0% in public non-residential building approvals, and an increase of 3.7% in private non-residential building approvals. Nationally, the value of non-residential building approvals decreased by 17.3% to \$4.9 billion.

Chart 1: Number of residential building approvals (moving annual total, original)




