The Australian Bureau of Statistics reintroduced reporting of trend estimates after they were suspended during the COVID-19 pandemic. However, due to irregular spending patterns over this period, trend estimates are not available from March 2020 to June 2022.

Monthly results (trend)

In March 2024, retail trade in the Territory increased by 0.3% to \$329 million compared with the previous month (Chart 1). The increase was driven by the categories of 'food retailing' (contributing 0.2 percentage points (ppt)), and 'cafes, restaurants and takeaway food' (contributing 0.1 ppt).

The Territory reported the strongest result of the jurisdictions, which otherwise ranged from a decrease of 0.2% in New South Wales to an increase of 0.2% in Tasmania. Nationally, retail trade turnover was flat at \$35.7 billion.


Annual results (trend)

Retail trade in the Territory increased by 3.5% in annual terms, the strongest result of the jurisdictions (Chart 2). The increase was driven by the categories of 'food retailing' (contributing 2.4 ppt), and 'other retailing' (contributing 0.9 ppt).

Year-on-year results (original data)


In the year to March 2024, retail spending in the Territory increased by 3.7% to \$3.9 billion, the fourth strongest result of the jurisdictions. In other jurisdictions, the change ranged from an increase of 1.3% in New South Wales to an increase of 4.5% in the Australian Capital Territory (Chart 3). Nationally, retail spending increased by 2.2% to \$427.5 billion over the same period.

The Territory's year-on-year result was largely influenced by increased spending on 'food retailing' (contributing 2.5 ppt) and 'cafes, restaurants and takeaway food' (contributing 1.2 ppt).





The following analysis uses chain volume data, which has been adjusted to account for inflation. The ABS does not publish inflation adjusted data for the components of Territory retail trade.

Quarterly and annual results (trend)

In inflation adjusted terms, the Territory's trend retail turnover increased by 0.2% to \$893 million in March quarter 2024 (Chart 4). This was the third strongest result of the jurisdictions, behind Tasmania (up by 0.8%) and Queensland (up by 0.3%).


Territory retail turnover increased by 0.5% in annual terms, which was the strongest result of the jurisdictions. In other jurisdictions, the annual change ranged from a decrease of 1.8% in New South Wales to an increase of 0.3% in Tasmania.


Nationally, retail turnover was flat at \$98.0 billion and decreased by 0.9% compared with the March quarter 2023.

Year-on-year results (original)

In the year to March 2024, retail turnover in the Territory decreased by 0.1% to \$3.6 billion (Chart 5).

The Territory recorded the fourth strongest year-on-year change of the jurisdictions. In other jurisdictions, the change ranged from a decrease of 1.9% in Queensland to an increase of 1.2% in the Australian Capital Territory. Nationally, retail trade decreased by 1.1% to \$393 billion over the same period.

Chart 5: Change in retail turnover (year-on-year percentage change, inflation adjusted, original)


