In September 2024, the trend number of residential building approvals in the Territory was unchanged at 39 (Chart 1), the third weakest result of the jurisdictions, which ranged from a decline of 21.8% in the Australian Capital Territory to an increase of 3.0% in Queensland. Nationally, residential building approvals increased by 1.2%.

Over the year to September 2024, the trend number of residential building approvals in the Territory was unchanged. This was the fourth weakest result of the jurisdictions, which ranged from a decline of 75.3% in the Australian Capital Territory to an increase of 58.0% in Western Australia. Nationally, residential building approvals increased by 4.4% (Chart 2).


Over the year to September 2024, the value of residential building approvals in the Territory declined by 11.2% to \$32.0 million. Nationally, the value of residential building approvals increased by 18.7% to \$8.6 billion.


Over the year to September 2024, the value of non-residential building approvals in the Territory increased by 108.5% to \$101.4 million, reflecting an increase of 279.7% in public non-residential building approvals, and an increase of 3.2% in private non-residential building approvals. Nationally, the value of non-residential building approvals increased by 2.2% to \$5.5 billion.

Term	Definition
Residential building	Buildings that contain one or more dwellings, intended for the provision of long-term accommodation.
Non-residential building	Building either classified as a commercial building, industrial building and other non-residential building.
Commercial building	Buildings primarily occupied with or engaged in commercial trade or work intended for commercial trade, including buildings used primarily for retail and wholesale trade, office and transport activities.
Industrial building	Buildings used for warehousing, primary production and the production and assembly activities of industrial or manufacturing processes.
Other non- residential building	Non-residential buildings for the provision of education, religious worship or other religious activities, aged and health care, recreation, entertainment, or commercial temporary accommodation.
