

Monthly consumer price index

National result

The national consumer price index (CPI) increased by 0.6% in July 2026, to be 3.5% higher in year-ended terms (seasonally adjusted).

The largest contributors to the year-ended result were:

- housing (up by 5.0% contributing 1.10 percentage points (ppt)), mainly driven by house purchase
- food and non-alcoholic beverages (up by 3.2% contributing 0.55 ppt), mainly driven by meals out and take away foods
- recreation and culture (up by 2.6% contributing 0.32 ppt), mainly driven by audio, visual and computing.

National trimmed mean CPI increased by 0.5% in the month, to be 3.6% higher in year-ended terms (Chart 1). The RBA forecasts the national trimmed mean to increase by 3.3% in the year-ended December quarter 2026.

Darwin result (original)

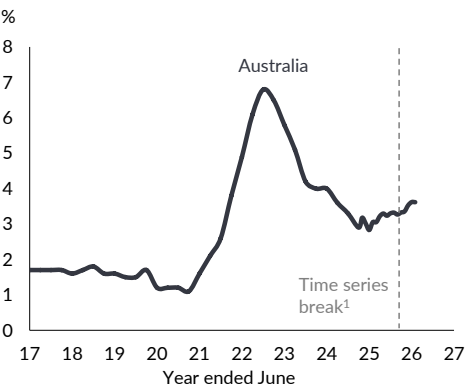
The Darwin CPI increased by 3.7% in the year-ended July 2026 (Chart 2). This was the fourth lowest result of the capital cities, which ranged from an increase of 3.2% in Sydney to an increase of 4.5% in Hobart (Chart 3).

The largest contributors to the year-ended result were:

- housing (up by 7.4% contributing 1.30 ppt), mainly driven by utilities
- food and non-alcoholic beverages (up by 3.1% contributing 0.60 ppt), mainly driven by meals out and take away foods.
- recreation and culture (up by 4.1% contributing 0.53 ppt), mainly driven by holiday travel and accommodation.

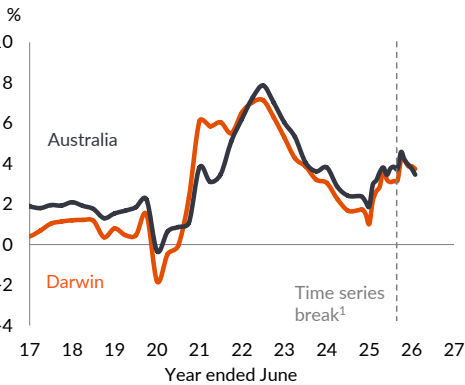
In the year-ended July 2026, the price of goods increased by 3.8% while the price of services increased by 3.7%. Nationally, the price of services increased by 3.8% while the price of goods increased by 3.2% in seasonally adjusted terms.

Chart 1: Trimmed mean consumer price index (monthly, year-ended change, seasonally adjusted)



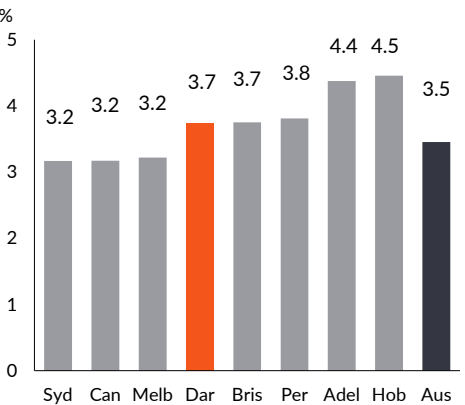

Chart 3: Capital cities consumer price index (monthly, year-ended change, original)

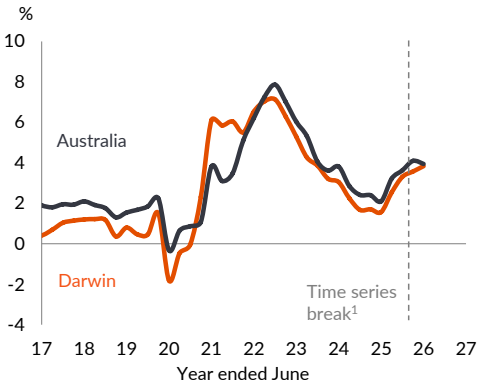

Quarterly result (June quarter 2026)

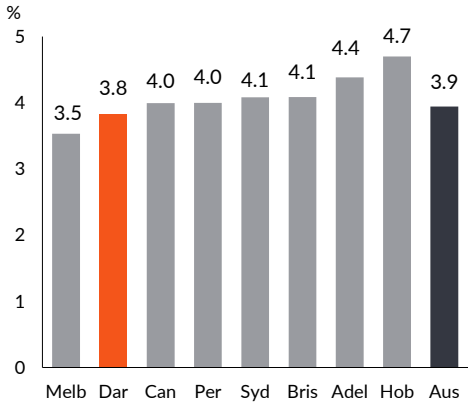
The Darwin CPI increased by 3.8% in the year-ended June quarter 2026. This was the second lowest result of the capital cities, which ranged from an increase of 3.5% in Melbourne to an increase of 4.7% in Hobart. Nationally, the CPI increased by 3.9% in the year-ended June quarter 2026.
