Internet jobs vacancy report

February 2022 | Economic brief

The Commonwealth Department of Education, Skills and Employment's (DESE) Vacancy Report is based on a count of newly lodged online job advertisements on a variety of job search websites. Unless stated otherwise, all data are reported in trend terms.

DESE advises the sum of the categories in trend terms may not equal the reported total due to the methodology behind the trend data series.

Monthly change

In February 2022, the number of internet job vacancies in the Territory decreased by 0.1% to 2,826 with 'labourers' (down by 0.7%), 'technicians and trades' (down by 0.5%) recording decreases. Demand for all other categories, except 'clerical and administrative' (flat) increased (Chart 1).

The Territory reported the only decrease, with results in other jurisdictions ranging from a 0.8% increase in Victoria to a 3.7% increase in the Australian Capital Territory. Nationally, the number of job vacancies increased by 1.3% to 264,144.

Annual change


In annual terms, the number of job vacancies in the Territory increased by 18.2%. The largest increases were in the categories of 'sales' (up by 39.6%) and 'clerical and administrative' (up by 30.6%). The Territory reported the second smallest increase of the jurisdictions, which ranged from a 15.3% increase in the Australian Capital Territory to a 32.1% increase in Victoria. Nationally, the number of vacancies increased by 28.8% (Chart 2).

Regional vacancies (original)

DESE only reports regional vacancy data in original terms, which can be volatile on a month-to-month basis. The Department of Treasury and Finance aggregates the data to quarters to smooth some of this volatility, though seasonal variations will remain.


In February 2022, the number of job vacancies in the Darwin region decreased by 2.4% to 1,795 (compared with January 2022) (Chart 3), with 'machinery operators and drivers' (down by 8.7%) and 'labourers' (down by 7.3%) reporting the largest decreases. In annual terms, Darwin job vacancies increased by 45.5%.

The number of vacancies across regional Northern Territory in the month decreased by 3.5% to 776, with 'professionals' (down by 9.2%) and 'machinery operators and drivers' (down by 8.6%) reporting the largest decreases. In annual terms, the number of regional job vacancies increased by 44.9%.




