In July 2022, seasonally adjusted resident employment in the Territory increased by 2.8% to 134,016 persons. Full-time employment increased by 2.9% and part-time employment increased by 2.6%. Nationally, employment decreased by 0.3%, with full-time employment decreasing by 0.9%, partly offset by part-time employment increasing by 1.1%.

Annually, seasonally adjusted resident employment increased by 3.7% in the Territory. Nationally, employment increased by 3.0% over the same period (Chart 1). In the year to July 2022, Territory employment increased by 1.6%, reflecting an increase in full-time employment of 3.0%, partly offset by a decrease in part-time employment of 2.5%. Nationally, year-on-year employment increased by 2.9%.

The Territory's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate decreased from 3.7% in June 2022 to 3.5% in July 2022 (Chart 2). Nationally, the monthly unemployment rate decreased from 3.5% to 3.4%.

The seasonally adjusted participation rate in the Territory increased by 1.4 percentage points to 72.5% in July 2022. The Territory's participation rate is the highest of the jurisdictions, and well above the national rate of 66.4% (Chart 3).


Chart 2: Unemployment rate (seasonally adjusted)
