Wage price index

March quarter 2023 | Economic brief

The wage price index (WPI) measures changes in the hourly price of labour. It reflects changes in awards, enterprise agreements, minimum wage, and individual contracts but does not reflect changes in the composition of the workforce or employee characteristics which may impact the quality and quantity of the work performed.

Territory WPI data are only reported in original terms. Data in this briefing is in original terms unless stated otherwise.

Quarterly result

The Territory WPI increased by 0.6% in the March quarter 2023, reflecting an increase of 0.6% in both the public and private sectors.

Nationally, the WPI increased by 0.8%, with an increase of 1.0% in the public sector and an increase of 0.7% in the private sector.

Annual result

The Territory WPI increased by 2.9% in annual terms (Chart 1), reflecting an increase of 4.1% in the private sector and an increase of 1.0% in the public sector (Chart 2).

The Territory reported the weakest annual growth of the jurisdictions. In other jurisdictions, the change in WPI ranged from 3.5% in New South Wales and Victoria to 4.1% in Tasmania and Western Australia (Chart 3).

Nationally, the WPI increased by 3.6% in annual terms, with an increase of 3.8% in the private sector and an increase of 2.9% in the public sector.

Nationally, the wholesale trade and other services industries, reported the strongest growth in the private sector, up by 4.4%. The industry that experienced the weakest growth in private sector wages in Australia was education and training, up by 3.1%.

Year-on-year result

The Territory reported a year-on-year WPI increase of 2.5%, reflecting an increase of 3.5% in the private sector and an increase of 0.9% in the public sector.

The national WPI increased by 3.2%, with an increase of 3.4% in the private sector and an increase of 2.6% in the public sector.



