

Internet job vacancy report

July 2026 | Economic brief

The Commonwealth Jobs and Skills Australia (JSA) Vacancy Report is based on a count of newly lodged online job advertisements in July 2026 on Seek, CareerOne, and Workforce Australia. Unless stated otherwise, all data are reported in trend terms.

Northern Territory (trend)

Internet jobs advertised in the Territory declined by 0.8% in July 2026. The largest declines were in the categories of 'community and personal services' (down by 3.9%) and 'professionals' (down by 2.4%), while the largest increases were in the categories of 'machinery operators and drivers' (up by 2.2%) and 'labourers' (up by 0.7%) (Chart 1).

Of all the jurisdictions, only the Territory reported a decline, which otherwise ranged from no change in New South Wales to an increase of 1.5% in Western Australia. Nationally, the number of new internet jobs advertised increased by 0.6%.

Internet jobs advertised in the Territory declined by 7.9% in year-ended July 2026. The largest declines were in the categories of 'community and personal services' (down by 16.3%) and 'professionals' (down by 13.4%), while the largest increases were in the categories of 'labourers' (up by 5.9%) and 'machinery operators and drivers' (up by 1.2%).

The Territory reported the largest decline of the jurisdictions, which otherwise ranged from a decline of 5.3% in the Australian Capital Territory to an increase of 4.8% in Western Australia. Nationally, the number of internet job vacancies declined by 1.0% (Chart 2).

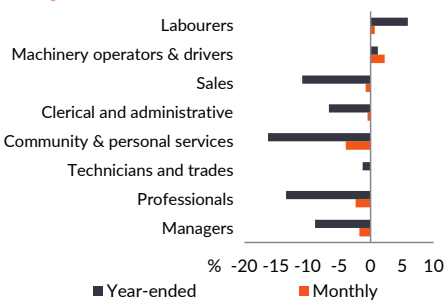
Regional vacancies (original)

JSA reports regional jobs advertised data in original terms, and as a three-month moving average, though seasonal variations remain.

Internet jobs advertised in the Darwin region declined by 14.4% in year-ended July 2026 (Chart 3), with 'community and personal service workers' (down by 19.5%) and 'professionals' (down by 18.1%) reporting the largest declines.

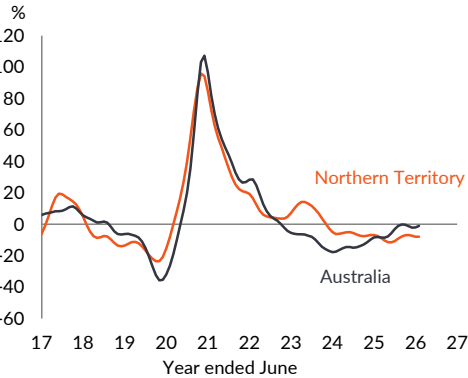
Internet jobs advertised across regional Northern Territory increased by 1.7% in year-ended July 2026, with 'labourers' (up by 32.6%) and 'technicians and trades workers' (up by 12.7%) reporting the largest increases.

Chart 1: Internet job vacancies by industry (change, trend)



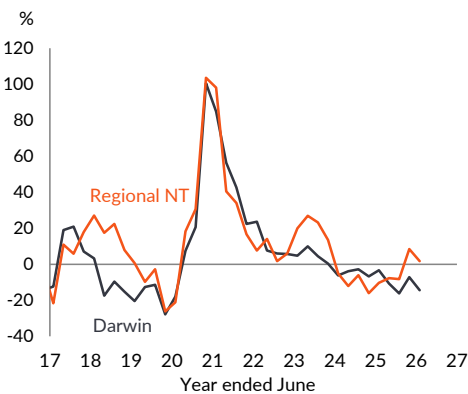

Term	Definition
Monthly change	Compares the latest month with the previous month
Year-ended change	Compares the latest month with the same month last year
Trend	A trend series is a seasonally adjusted series that has been further adjusted to remove irregular effects and 'smooth' out the series to show the overall 'trend' of the data over time.
