Residential building approvals

In November 2022, the number of residential building approvals in the Territory decreased by 11.7% to 53, the weakest result of the jurisdictions, which otherwise ranged from a decrease of 6.2% in Western Australia to an increase of 1.9% in Tasmania. Nationally, residential building approvals decreased by 2.4%.

In annual terms, the number of residential building approvals in the Territory increased by 55.9%. This was the strongest result of the jurisdictions, which otherwise ranged from a decrease of 41.8% in the Australian Capital Territory to an increase of 7.1% in Tasmania. Nationally, residential building approvals decreased by 11.5%.

In the year to November 2022, residential building approvals in the Territory decreased by 3.8% to 654, compared with a decrease of 17.8% to 189,223 nationally (Chart 1). The Territory reported the second strongest result of the jurisdictions, which otherwise ranged from a decrease of 37.6% in Western Australia to an increase of 10.9% in the Australian Capital Territory (Chart 2). House approvals decreased by 19.9%, unit and townhouse approvals increased by 57.4%, and alterations, additions and conversions approvals increased by 600.0% from 10 to 70.

In the year to November 2022, the value of residential building approvals in the Territory decreased by 7.3% to \$361.5 million, compared with a decrease of 3.4% to \$88.5 billion nationally.

Non-residential approvals

In November 2022, the value of non-residential building approvals in the Territory decreased by 82.9% to \$20.1 million, reflecting a decrease of 96.1% in public non-residential building approvals, partly offset by an increase of 13.0% in private non-residential building approvals. Nationally, the value of non-residential building approvals increased by 19.2% to \$5.9 billion.

Chart 1: Number of residential building approvals (moving annual total, original)






Chart 2: Number of residential building approvals (year-on-year percentage change)
