Internet job vacancy report

June 2024 | Economic brief

The Commonwealth Jobs and Skills Australia (JSA) Vacancy Report is based on a count of newly lodged online job advertisements on a variety of job search websites. Unless stated otherwise, all data are reported in trend terms.

Monthly change

In June 2024, the number of internet job vacancies in the Territory decreased by 1.7% to 3,081. All categories reported decreases in the month, with the largest being 'machinery operators and drivers' (down by 2.5%) and 'community and personal services' (down by 2.2%) (Chart 1).

All jurisdictions reported monthly decreases in internet job vacancies, with the Territory reporting the equal fourth smallest decline, alongside New South Wales. Decreases ranged from 3.5% in Tasmania to 0.4% in Queensland. Nationally, the number of job vacancies decreased by 1.6% to 230,686.

Annual change

In annual terms, the number of job vacancies in the Territory decreased by 7.6%. All categories reported decreases through the year, with the largest being 'professionals' (down by 14.1%) and 'labourers' (down by 7.2%). The Territory reported the second smallest decline of the jurisdictions, which ranged from a decrease of 25.3% in Victoria to a decrease of 5.1% in Tasmania. Nationally, the number of vacancies decreased by 18.2% (Chart 2).

Regional vacancies (original)

JSA only reports regional vacancy data in original terms, which can be volatile on a month-to-month basis. The Department of Treasury and Finance aggregates the data to a three month moving average to smooth some of this volatility, though seasonal variations will remain.


In June 2024, the number of job vacancies in the Darwin region decreased by 3.5% to 2,206 (compared with May 2024) (Chart 3), with 'machinery operators and drivers' (down by 7.1%) and 'community and personal service workers' (down by 6.9%) reporting the largest decreases. In annual terms, Darwin job vacancies decreased by 2.9%.

The number of vacancies across regional Northern Territory in the month decreased by 5.6% to 991, with labourers (down by 11.1%) and 'community and personal service workers' (down by 10.3%) reporting the largest decreases. In annual terms, the number of regional job vacancies increased by 2.4%.


Chart 1: Internet job vacancies by industry
