Construction work done

December quarter 2023 | Economic brief

The ABS advises lower survey response rates due to COVID-19 has not significantly impacted the quality of the estimates in the publication. More detailed construction information will be available in the building activity and engineering construction activity, December quarter 2023 releases.

In the December quarter 2023, trend construction work done in the Territory increased by 4.0% to \$856 million. This was due to an increase of 5.5% in engineering work done to \$560 million, and an increase of 1.1% in building work done to \$296 million. Nationally, the value of construction work done increased by 1.0%.

In 2023, the value of construction work done in the Territory was \$3.2 billion (Chart 1), an increase of 7.6% compared with the previous year, and the fourth strongest result of the jurisdictions. Other jurisdictions ranged from an increase of 1.5% in South Australia to an increase of 15.0% in Western Australia (Chart 2). Nationally, the value of total construction work done increased by 9.0% in the year.

Engineering work done

In 2023, the value of engineering work done in the Territory increased by 0.9% to \$2.1 billion. The Territory experienced a period of very significant engineering construction activity from 2013 to 2018 associated with the globally significant Ichthys LNG project. Given that the Territory is a small open economy, major projects have a very large impact on headline construction indicators.


Residential building work done

In 2023, the value of residential building work done in the Territory increased by 2.0% to \$355 million. This reflects an increase of 15.5% in new houses, partly offset by a decrease of 12.4% in new units and townhouses (new other residential) and a decrease of 15.4% in alterations and additions.

Non-residential building work done

In 2023, the value of non-residential building work done in the Territory increased by 35.5% to \$780 million (Chart 3). This reflects an increase of 49.1% in public sector work done to \$553 million, and an increase of 10.9% in private sector work done to \$227 million.

Chart 1: Territory construction (moving annual total, original, inflation adjusted)






Chart 2: Construction work done (year-on-year change, original, inflation adjusted)





Chart 3: Territory non-residential building (moving annual total, original, inflation adjusted)
