Internet job vacancy report

April 2024 | Economic brief

The Commonwealth Jobs and Skills Australia (JSA) Vacancy Report is based on a count of newly lodged online job advertisements on a variety of job search websites. Unless stated otherwise, all data are reported in trend terms.

Monthly change

In April 2024, the number of internet job vacancies in the Territory decreased by 0.3% to 3,299. The largest decreases were in the categories of 'technicians and trades' (down by 1.7%) and 'managers' (down by 1.6%), while 'sales' (up by 1.1%) and 'community and personal services' (up by 0.3%) reported the only increases (Chart 1).

The Territory reported the fourth weakest result of the jurisdictions, which ranged from a decrease of 1.1% in Tasmania to an increase of 0.5% in the Australian Capital Territory. Nationally, the number of job vacancies decreased by 0.7% to 243,346.

Annual change

In annual terms, the number of job vacancies in the Territory increased by 1.5%. The largest increases were in the categories of 'machinery operators and drivers' (up by 7.9%) and 'community and personal services' (up by 6.4%), while 'labourers' (down by 2.1%) and 'technicians and trades' (down by 1.4%) reported the only decreases. The Territory reported the second strongest result of the jurisdictions, which ranged from a decrease of 21.9% in Victoria to an increase of 5.6% in Tasmania. Nationally, the number of vacancies decreased by 15.0% (Chart 2).


Regional vacancies (original)

JSA only reports regional vacancy data in original terms, which can be volatile on a month-to-month basis. The Department of Treasury and Finance aggregates the data to a three month moving average to smooth some of this volatility, though seasonal variations will remain.

In April 2024, the number of job vacancies in the Darwin region decreased by 2.5% to 2,263 (compared with March 2024) (Chart 3), with 'community and personal service workers' (down by 5.9%) and 'machinery operators and drivers' (down by 5.3%) reporting the largest decreases. In annual terms, Darwin job vacancies increased by 0.4%.

The number of vacancies across regional Northern Territory in the month decreased by 1.8% to 1,079, with 'machinery operators and drivers' (down by 7.1%) and 'managers' (down by 6.2%) reporting the largest decreases. In annual terms, the number of regional job vacancies increased by 13.6%.
