

The Commonwealth Department of Employment's Internet Vacancy Report is based on a count of online job advertisements newly lodged on a variety of job search websites. It does not capture all vacancies as around one third of vacancies are not formally advertised. Unless stated otherwise, all data referred to below is in trend terms.

### Monthly Change

In June 2017, the trend number of new vacancies advertised in the Territory decreased 0.5 per cent to 1699. There were monthly increases in 'managers' (up 1.5 per cent), and 'professionals' (up 0.9 per cent). This was offset by decreases in all other categories with the largest decreases in 'community and personal service workers' (down 3.2 per cent) (Chart 1).

The Territory recorded the lowest monthly result of the jurisdictions. In other jurisdictions, the monthly result ranged from a 0.3 per cent decrease in Western Australia to 1.2 per cent in Victoria. Nationally, the number of vacancies advertised increased by 0.9 per cent in the month to 171 777.

### Annual Change

The number of vacancies in the Territory declined by 11.9 per cent through the year to June 2017 (Chart 2). The Territory recorded the largest decline of the jurisdictions. In other jurisdictions, the annual change ranged from a decline of 3.1 per cent in the Australian Capital Territory to an increase of 13.3 per cent in South Australia.

All categories in the Territory experienced an annual decrease in the number of job vacancies advertised.

Nationally, the number of vacancies increased by 3.1 per cent through the year to June 2017.

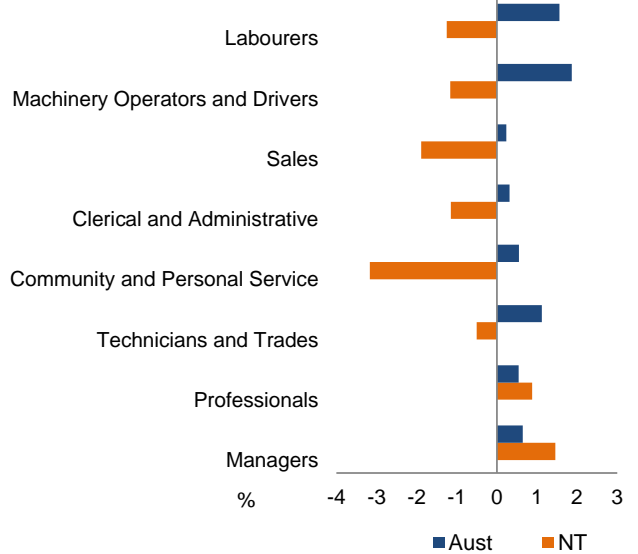
### Regional Vacancies (original)

Regional vacancy numbers are reported on a three month moving average basis, in original terms. As such, data may be volatile due to seasonal variations.

In June 2017, the number of vacancies in the Darwin region decreased by 2.7 per cent to 1375, reflecting decreases across most occupational groups (Chart 3). The largest decrease was in 'labourers' (down 13.4 per cent). In annual terms, the number of vacancies declined by 17.1 per cent.

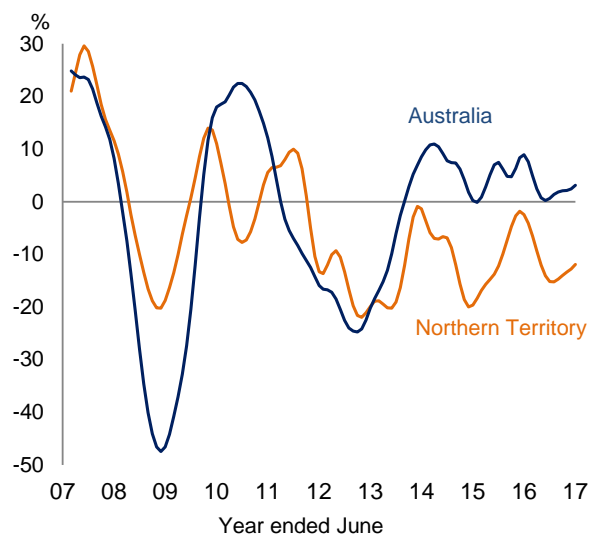
The number of vacancies across Regional Northern Territory decreased by 2.6 per cent in the month to 392. In annual terms, the number of vacancies decreased by 18.2 per cent. The largest declines were in 'clerical and administrative workers' (down 33.8 per cent), and 'professionals' (down 23.1 per cent).

Chart 1: Internet Vacancies by Industry, Monthly Percentage Change, Trend



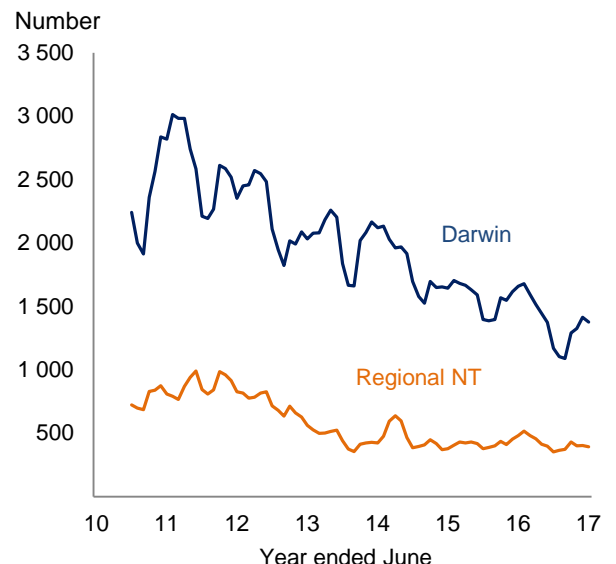
