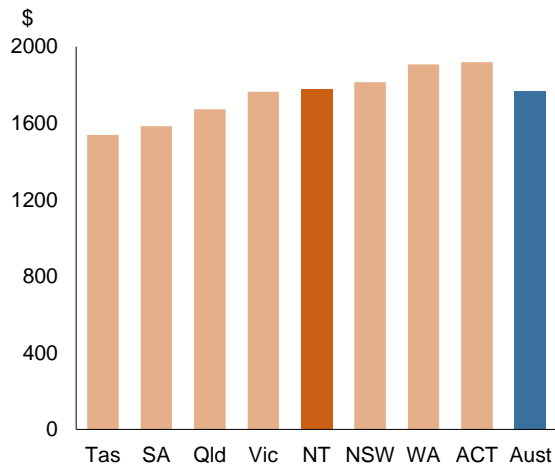


# Average weekly full-time earnings

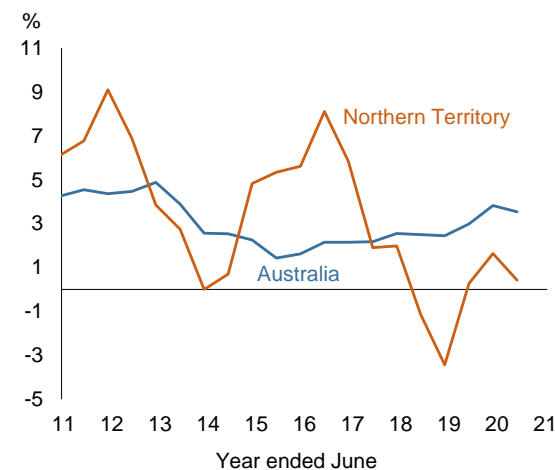

Chart 1: Average weekly full-time earnings (biannually, seasonally adjusted)



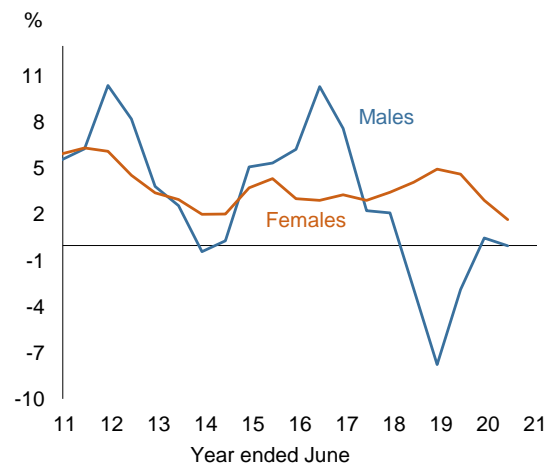

The Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) advises that JobKeeper payments are not included in average weekly full-time earnings.

Average weekly full-time adult earnings (AWFTE) data should be viewed with caution as it can be a volatile measure of wage growth, affected by the overall labour force composition such as:

- occupational distribution within and across industries
- distribution of employment between industries
- proportion of male and female employees.

## Biannual result

In the six months to November 2020, the seasonally adjusted AWFTE in the Territory was \$1777. This was the fourth highest level of all the jurisdictions, behind the Australian Capital Territory (\$1919), Western Australia (\$1908) and New South Wales (\$1815). Nationally, the seasonally adjusted AWFTE was \$1767 (Chart 1).

The seasonally adjusted AWFTE in the Territory decreased by 0.5 per cent, reflecting a decrease in female AWFTE of 1.1 per cent to \$1626, partly offset by an increase in male AWFTE of 0.1 per cent to \$1914.

Nationally, the seasonally adjusted AWFTE decreased by 0.2 per cent to \$1767. This reflected a decrease in male AWFTE of 0.5 per cent to \$1883, partly offset by an increase in female AWFTE of 0.3 per cent to \$1582.

## Year-on-year result

In the year to November 2020, the Territory AWFTE increased by 0.4 per cent (Chart 2), the weakest of the jurisdictions. AWFTE growth in other jurisdictions ranged from 1.7 per cent in Tasmania to 4.8 per cent in Victoria. Nationally, AWFTE increased by 3.5 per cent.

AWFTE in the Territory increased by 1.7 per cent for females, however was flat for males (Chart 3). Nationally, male AWFTE increased by 3.3 per cent and by 4.1 per cent for females.

ABS changed the release of Average Weekly Earnings data from quarterly to biannually (May and November of each year).
