Internet job vacancy report

January 2023 | Economic brief

The Commonwealth Jobs and Skills Australia (JSA) Vacancy Report is based on a count of newly lodged online job advertisements on a variety of job search websites. Unless stated otherwise, all data are reported in trend terms.

Monthly change

In January 2023, the number of internet job vacancies in the Territory increased by 0.5% to 3,004. The largest increases were in the categories of 'labourers' and 'community and personal services' (both up by 1.5%), while the largest decreases were in 'sales' (down by 1.9%) and 'clerical and administrative' (down by 0.4%) (Chart 1).

The Territory reported the fourth weakest result of the jurisdictions, which ranged from a decrease of 1.5% in Victoria to an increase of 1.2% in South Australia. Nationally, the number of job vacancies increased by 0.4% to 277,035.

Annual change

In annual terms, the number of job vacancies in the Territory increased by 2.4%. The largest increases were in the categories of 'community and personal services' (up by 14.6%) and 'professionals' (up by 13.0%), while the largest decreases were in the categories of 'sales' (down by 15.8%) and 'clerical and administrative' (down by 10.0%)

The Territory reported the third smallest increase of the jurisdictions, which ranged from a decrease of 2.2% in Victoria to an increase of 13.8% in Tasmania. Nationally, the number of vacancies increased by 3.6% (Chart 2).

Regional vacancies (original)

JSA only reports regional vacancy data in original terms, which can be volatile on a month-to-month basis. The Department of Treasury and Finance aggregates the data to a three month moving average to smooth some of this volatility, though seasonal variations will remain.

In January 2023, the number of job vacancies in the Darwin region increased by 0.4% to 1,951 (compared with December 2022) (Chart 3), with 'labourers' (up by 10.7%) and 'technicians and trades workers' (up by 3.3%) reporting the largest increases. In annual terms, Darwin job vacancies increased by 6.1%.


The number of vacancies across regional Northern Territory in the month increased by 1.7% to 819, with 'community and personal service workers' (up by 9.5%) and 'labourers' (up by 5.2%) reporting the largest increases. In annual terms, the number of regional job vacancies increased by 1.8%.

Chart 1: Internet job vacancies by industry




