Residential building approvals

In April 2023, the number of residential building approvals in the Territory decreased by 2.4% to 40 in trend terms, the fourth strongest result of the jurisdictions, which otherwise ranged from a decrease of 15.1% in the Australian Capital Territory to an increase of 0.5% in Western Australia. Nationally, residential building approvals decreased by 4.2%.

In annual terms, the number of residential building approvals in the Territory decreased by 29.8%. This was the third weakest result of the jurisdictions, which otherwise ranged from a decrease of 52.5% in the Australian Capital Territory to a decrease of 7.3% in South Australia. Nationally, residential building approvals decreased by 25.5%.

In the year to April 2023, residential building approvals in the Territory increased by 15.5% to 619, compared with a decrease of 14.6% to 177,940 nationally (Chart 1). The Territory reported the strongest result of the jurisdictions, which otherwise ranged from a decrease of 21.6% in Western Australia to a decrease of 5.9% in Tasmania (Chart 2). House approvals increased by 38.1%, unit and townhouse approvals decreased by 4.7%, and alterations, additions and conversions approvals decreased by 82.9% from 70 to 12.


In the year to April 2023, the value of residential building approvals in the Territory increased by 28.7% to \$391.3 million, compared with a decrease of 0.2% to \$88.2 billion nationally.


In April 2023, the value of non-residential building approvals in the Territory increased by 50.2% to \$68.2 million, reflecting an increase of 86.3% in private non-residential building approvals, and an increase of 19.1% in public non-residential building approvals. Nationally, the value of non-residential building approvals decreased by 2.9% to \$5.1 billion.

Chart 1: Number of residential building approvals (moving annual total, original)




