November 2023 | Economic brief

Average weekly full-time adult earnings (AWFTE) data should be viewed with caution as it can be a volatile measure of wage growth, affected by the overall labour force composition such as:

- occupational distribution within and across industries
- distribution of employment between industries
- proportion of male and female employees.

Biannual result

In the six months to November 2023, the trend AWFTE in the Territory was \$1,950. This was the fourth highest level of the jurisdictions. Nationally, the trend AWFTE was \$1,954 (Chart 1).

The trend AWFTE in the Territory increased by 3.0%, reflecting an increase in male AWFTE of 3.3% to \$2,132 and an increase in female AWFTE of 3.0% to \$1,740.

Nationally, the trend AWFTE increased by 2.2% to \$1,954. This reflected an increase in female AWFTE of 2.7% to \$1,767 and an increase in male AWFTE of 2.0% to \$2,077.

Annual result


Through the year to November 2023, the trend AWFTE in the Territory increased by 5.3% (Chart 2), the third strongest result of the jurisdictions. AWFTE growth in other jurisdictions ranged from 3.2% in Victoria to 5.7% in Tasmania.

AWFTE in the Territory increased by 6.2% for males and increased by 4.1% for females (Chart 3). Nationally, AWFTE increased by 4.2%, reflecting an increase of 3.7% for males and an increase of 5.2% for females.

Year-on-year result


In the year to November 2023, the Territory AWFTE increased by 4.1%. Nationally, AWFTE also increased by 4.1%. AWFTE in the Territory increased by 5.6% for males and increased by 1.9% for females. Nationally, AWFTE increased by 3.7% for males and increased by 5.0% for females.






