The Australian Bureau of Statistics reintroduced reporting of trend estimates after they were suspended during the COVID-19 pandemic. However, due to irregular spending patterns over this period, trend estimates are not available from March 2020 to June 2022.

Monthly results

Retail trade in the Territory increased by 0.1% to \$325 million in January 2024 compared with the previous month (Chart 1). The increase was driven by the categories of 'household goods' and 'food retailing'.

The Territory reported the fourth strongest result of the jurisdictions, which ranged from a decrease of 0.2% in the Australian Capital Territory to an increase of 0.7% in Tasmania. Nationally, retail trade turnover was unchanged at \$35.7 billion.


Annual results

Retail trade in the Territory increased by 2.9% in annual terms (Chart 2), the equal strongest result of the jurisdictions, alongside Tasmania. The largest contributor to annual growth was 'food retailing' (contributing 2.0 ppt).

Year-on-year results


In January 2024, retail spending in the Territory increased by 3.6% to \$3.9 billion, the fourth strongest result of the jurisdictions. In other jurisdictions, results ranged from an increase of 1.5% in Queensland to an increase of 5.4% in the Australian Capital Territory (Chart 3). Nationally, retail spending increased by 2.6% to \$425.4 billion over the same period.

The Territory's year-on-year result was largely influenced by increased spending on 'food retailing' (contributing 2.1 ppt) and 'cafes, restaurants and takeaway food' (contributing 1.5 ppt).

Chart 3: Retail turnover (year-on-year percentage change, current prices)


