The Territory's estimated resident population increased by 0.2% (448 persons) to 254,263 in the March quarter 2024, to be 0.8% higher over the year (Chart 1).

Net interstate migration (-1,061 persons) detracted from growth, while net overseas migration (+826 persons) and natural increase (+683 persons) contributed to population growth in the March quarter 2024.

Nationally, population increased by increased by 0.6% in the March quarter 2024 to be 2.3% higher over the year.

Population changes over the year ranged from an increase of 0.4% in Tasmania to an increase of 3.1% in Western Australia (Chart 2).

Natural increase

The Territory recorded a natural increase of 683 persons, comprising 948 births and 265 deaths in the March quarter 2024. Natural increase contributed 2,182 persons to the Territory population in the year to March 2024 (Chart 3).

Net interstate migration


Net interstate migration detracted 1,061 persons from the Territory population in the March quarter 2024, an increase from the net loss of 931 persons in the March quarter 2023. There were 4,476 departures from, and 3,415 arrivals to the Territory in the March quarter 2024.

Net interstate migration detracted 4,087 persons from the Territory population in the year to March 2024, an increase from the net loss of 2,745 persons in the year to March 2023.

Net overseas migration

Net overseas migration contributed 826 persons to the population in the March quarter 2024, and 3,920 persons over the year (Chart 3). This represents an improvement compared to the net gain of 3,321 persons in year to March 2023.

Nationally, net overseas migration contributed 133,802 persons to the population in the March quarter 2024, and 509,754 persons over the year.



Term	Definition
Estimated resident population	The official Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) population measure that represents the number of persons who reside in a defined locality for more than six months of the year and for a period of at least 12 out of 16 consecutive months.
Natural increase	The number of births minus the number of deaths.
Net interstate migration	The number of people arriving minus the number of people departing over a state or territory boundary that involves a change in place of usual residence.
Net overseas migration	The difference between the number of incoming travellers who stay in Australia for 12 months or more and are added to the population, and the number of outgoing travellers who leave Australia for 12 months or more and are subtracted from the population.
Quarterly change	Compares the latest quarter with the previous quarter.
Year-ended change	Compares the latest quarter with the same quarter last year.
Year-average change	Compares the 4 quarters up to and including the latest quarter with the previous 4-quarter period.

The Department of Treasury and Finance have updated the terminology used in the economic brief publications when referencing growth. The table below provides a comparison of the updated terminology with the prior terminology. This is a terminology update only and does not impact the definition or growth calculation.
