Internet jobs vacancy report

March 2022 | Economic brief

The Commonwealth Department of Education, Skills and Employment's (DESE) Vacancy Report is based on a count of newly lodged online job advertisements on a variety of job search websites. Unless stated otherwise, all data are reported in trend terms.

DESE advises the sum of the categories in trend terms may not equal the reported total due to the methodology behind the trend data series.

Monthly change

In March 2022, the number of internet job vacancies in the Territory increased by 2.1% to 3,007. The largest increases were in the categories of 'machinery operators and drivers' (up by 3.1%) and 'community and personal services' (up by 2.7%), with demand for all categories increasing, except 'labourers' (down by 0.9%) (Chart 1).

The Territory reported the third lowest increase, with results in other jurisdictions ranging from a 1.9% increase in Western Australia to a 4.5% increase in the Australian Capital Territory. Nationally, the number of job vacancies increased by 2.7% to 277,497.

Annual change


In annual terms, the number of job vacancies in the Territory increased by 19.4%. The largest increases were in the categories of 'sales' (up by 37.3%) and 'professionals' (up by 27.4%). The Territory reported the second smallest increase of the jurisdictions, which ranged from a 19.1% increase in the Australian Capital Territory to a 29.3% increase in Victoria. Nationally, the number of vacancies increased by 25.5% (Chart 2).

Regional vacancies (original)

DESE only reports regional vacancy data in original terms, which can be volatile on a month-to-month basis. The Department of Treasury and Finance aggregates the data to quarters to smooth some of this volatility, though seasonal variations will remain.

In March 2022, the number of job vacancies in the Darwin region increased by 17.5% to 2,110 (compared with February 2022) (Chart 3), with 'machinery operators and drivers' (up by 28.3%) and 'community and personal service workers' (up by 22.1%) reporting the largest increases. In annual terms, Darwin job vacancies increased by 27.1%.

The number of vacancies across regional Northern Territory in the month increased by 12.4% to 872, with 'clerical and administrative workers' (up by 20.0%) and 'machinery operators and drivers' (up by 17.1%) reporting the largest increases. In annual terms, the number of regional job vacancies increased by 19.0%.




