Residential building approvals

In May 2022, the number of residential building approvals in the Territory decreased by 3.7% to 52, the weakest result of the jurisdictions, which otherwise ranged from a decrease of 2.8% in Victoria to an increase of 1.9% in Western Australia. Nationally, residential building approvals decreased by 1.5%.

Through the year to May 2022, the number of residential building approvals in the Territory decreased by 20.0%. This was the smallest annual decrease of the jurisdictions, with the Australian Capital Territory reporting the only increase of 36.3%. Nationally, residential building approvals decreased by 23.4%.

In the year to May 2022, residential building approvals in the Territory decreased by 39.5% to 525, compared with a decrease of 4.8% nationally to 204,869 (Chart 1). The Territory reported the weakest result of the jurisdictions, which otherwise ranged from a decrease of 26.8% in Western Australia to an increase in 15.9% in the Australian Capital Territory (Chart 2). House approvals decreased by 45.2%, and unit and townhouse approvals decreased by 52.1%, while alterations, additions and conversions approvals increased by 222.7%.


In the year to May 2022, the value of residential building approvals in the Territory decreased by 28.1% to \$304.7 million, compared with an increase of 7.3% to \$88.4 billion nationally.


In May 2022, the value of non-residential building approvals in the Territory increased by 244.8% to \$28.9 million, reflecting an increase of 923.2% in public non-residential building approvals, and an increase of 107.1% in private non-residential building approvals. Nationally, the value of non-residential building approvals increased by 65.4% to \$6.4 billion.

Chart 1: Number of residential building approvals (moving annual total, original)




