Residential building approvals

In March 2024, the number of residential building approvals in the Territory decreased by 8.3% to 22, the weakest result of the jurisdictions, which otherwise ranged from a decrease of 4.1% in the Australian Capital Territory to an increase of 3.0% in Western Australia. Nationally, residential building approvals decreased by 1.1%.

In annual terms, the number of residential building approvals in the Territory decreased by 46.3%. This was the weakest result of the jurisdictions, which otherwise ranged from a decrease of 17.4% in Queensland to an increase of 36.2% in Western Australia. Nationally, residential building approvals decreased by 7.3%.

In the year to March 2024, residential building approvals in the Territory decreased by 34.7% to 389, compared with a decrease of 12.1% to 161,527 nationally (Chart 1). The Territory reported the weakest result of the jurisdictions, which otherwise ranged from a decrease of 17.3% in Tasmania to a decrease of 4.5% in Western Australia (Chart 2). Alterations, additions and conversions approvals decreased by 55.6% from 9 to 4, house approvals decreased by 34.5%, and unit and townhouse approvals decreased by 33.8%.


In the year to March 2024, the value of residential building approvals in the Territory decreased by 8.5% to \$340.5 million, compared with a decrease of 3.6% to \$87.3 billion nationally.


In March 2024, the value of non-residential building approvals in the Territory increased by 701.7% to \$254.0 million, reflecting an increase of 1229.6% in public non-residential building approvals, slightly offset by a decrease of 29.9% in private non-residential building approvals. Nationally, the value of non-residential building approvals increased by 28.4% to \$5.2 billion.

Chart 3: Territory residential building approvals (moving annual total)


