### Residential building approvals

In October 2024, the trend number of residential building approvals in the Territory was unchanged at 37, the weakest result of the jurisdictions, which otherwise ranged from an increase of 0.5% in South Australia to an increase of 3.6% in the Australian Capital Territory. Nationally, residential building approvals increased by 1.7% (Chart 1).

Over the year to October 2024, the trend number of residential building approvals in the Territory increased by 2.8%. This was the fourth weakest result of the jurisdictions, which otherwise ranged from a decline of 72.6% in the Australian Capital Territory to an increase of 48.4% in Western Australia (Chart 2). Nationally, residential building approvals increased by 8.4%.

In the year to October 2024, the value of residential building approvals in the Territory declined by 46.0% to \$28.7 million, compared with an increase of 15.3% to \$9.3 billion nationally.

## Non-residential approvals

In October 2024, the value of non-residential building approvals in the Territory declined by 25.2% to \$34.6 million, reflecting a decline of 27.3% in private non-residential building approvals, partly offset by an increase of 6.1% in public non-residential building approvals. Nationally, the value of non-residential building approvals decline by 20.5% to \$5.1 billion.

Chart 1: Number of residential building approvals (monthly, trend)





Chart 2: Number of residential building approvals (year-ended change, trend)

Term	Definition
Residential building	Buildings that contain one or more dwellings, intended for the provision of long-term accommodation.
Non-residential building	Building either classified as a commercial building, industrial building and other non-residential building.
Commercial building	Buildings primarily occupied with or engaged in commercial trade or work intended for commercial trade, including buildings used primarily for retail and wholesale trade, office and transport activities.
Industrial building	Buildings used for warehousing, primary production and the production and assembly activities of industrial or manufacturing processes.
Other non-residential building	Non-residential buildings for the provision of education, religious worship or other religious activities, aged and health care, recreation, entertainment, or commercial temporary accommodation.
