# Internet job vacancy report

#### September 2024 | Economic brief

The Commonwealth Jobs and Skills Australia (JSA) Vacancy Report is based on a count of newly lodged online job advertisements in September 2024 on Seek, CareerOne, and Workforce Australia. Unless stated otherwise, all data are reported in trend terms.

## **Northern Territory (trend)**

The number of new jobs advertised in the Territory increased by 0.7% to 3,192 in September 2024, The largest increases were in the categories of 'clerical and administrative' (up by 1.1%) and 'professionals' (up by 0.7%), while the largest declines were in the categories of 'machinery operators and drivers' (down by 0.6%) and 'community and personal services' and 'managers' (both down by 0.3%) (Chart 1).

The Territory reported the second largest increase of the jurisdictions equal with Queensland, which ranged from no change in New South Wales to an increase of 0.8% in Western Australia. Nationally, the number of new jobs advertised increased by 0.6%.

The number of new jobs advertised in the Territory declined by 6.1% over the year to September 2024. The largest declines were in the categories of 'machinery operators and drivers' (down by 16.1%) and 'professionals' (down by 15.2%), while the largest increases were in the categories of 'clerical and administrative' (up by 2.4%) and 'sales' (up by 1.6%).

The Territory reported the smallest decline of the jurisdictions, which otherwise ranged from a decline of 22.6% in Victoria to a decline of 6.6% in Queensland. Nationally, the number of vacancies declined by 15.3% (Chart 2).

## Regional jobs advertised (original)

JSA reports regional jobs advertised data in original terms, and as a three month moving average, though seasonal variations remain.

The number of new jobs advertised in the Darwin region declined by 4.1% (Chart 3) over the year to September 2024, with 'machinery operators and drivers' (down by 13.2%) and 'professionals' (down by 10.4%) reporting the largest declines.


The number of new jobs advertised across regional Northern Territory declined by 8.6% over the year to September 2024, with 'professionals' (down by 19.9%) and 'machinery operators and drivers' (down by 9.6%) reporting the largest declines.

Chart 1: Internet job vacancies by industry (change, trend)





Monthly change	Compares the latest month with the previous month
Year-ended change	Compares the latest month with the same month last year
Year-average change	Compares the 12 months up to and including the latest month with the previous 12 month period
Trend	A trend series is a seasonally adjusted series that has been further adjusted to remove irregular effects and 'smooth' out the series to show the overall 'trend' of the data over time.

The Department of Treasury and Finance have updated the terminology used in the economic brief publications when referencing growth. The table below provides a comparison of the updated terminology with the prior terminology. This is a terminology update only and does not impact the definition or growth calculation.
