Since the onset of COVID-19 the Australian Bureau of Statistics has suspended reporting trend estimates due to the sudden and extreme changes in retail expenditure (e.g. changes to regular and seasonal patterns) which significantly impacts the trend estimation process.

Monthly results (seasonally adjusted data)

In June 2022 retail trade in the Territory increased by 1.8% to \$310 million compared with the previous month (Chart 1). The increase is driven by increases in turnover in the categories of 'cafes, restaurants and takeaway food' (contributing 1.0 percentage points (ppt) to growth), 'food retailing' (0.7ppt) and 'household goods' (0.2 ppt).

The Territory reported the strongest result of the jurisdictions, which otherwise ranged from a 0.2% decrease in New South Wales to a 0.7% increase in Queensland. Nationally, retail trade turnover increased by 0.2% to \$34.2 billion.

Annual results (seasonally adjusted data)

Retail trade in the Territory increased by 5.4% in annual terms, the second weakest result of the jurisdictions (Chart 2). The largest detractor from annual growth was 'food retailing' (detracting 1.0 ppt).

Year-on-year results (original data)

In 2021-22, retail spending in the Territory increased by 1.1% to \$3.6 billion, ranking the second lowest of the jurisdictions. In other jurisdictions, the change ranged from a 1.3% decrease in the Australian Capital Territory to a 10.2% increase in Victoria (Chart 3). Nationally, retail spending increased by 5.9% to \$386.6 billion over the same period.

The Territory's year-on-year result was influenced by increased spending on 'other retailing' and 'cafes, restaurants and takeaway food'.




Chart 2: Retail turnover (annual percentage change, current prices, seasonally adjusted)





Chart 3: Retail turnover (year-on-year percentage change, current prices)

The following analysis uses chain volume data, which has been adjusted to account for inflation. The ABS does not publish inflation adjusted data for the components of Territory retail trade.

Quarterly and annual results (seasonally adjusted)

In inflation adjusted terms, the Territory's seasonally adjusted retail turnover decreased by 0.2% to \$836 million in the June quarter 2022, the third consecutive quarterly decline (Chart 4). This result was the only decline of the jurisdictions. In other jurisdictions results ranged from no change in the Australian Capital Territory to a 2.4% increase in Queensland.

Territory retail turnover decreased by 2.3% in annual terms which was the weakest result of the jurisdictions. In other jurisdictions, the annual increase ranged from 0.1% in the Australian Capital Territory to 7.8% in Victoria.

Nationally, retail turnover increased by 5.5% in the quarter to \$94.3 billion, and by 5.5% compared with the June quarter 2021.

Year-on-year results (original)

In 2021-22, retail turnover in the Territory decreased by 1.7% to \$3.4 billion (Chart 5).

The Territory recorded the second weakest year-on-year change of the jurisdictions. In other jurisdictions, the change ranged from a 4.1% decrease in the Australian Capital Territory to a 7.4% increase in Victoria. Nationally, retail trade increased by 3.0% to \$365 billion over the same period.
