The December quarter 2021 publication includes rebased 30 June 2021 estimated resident population numbers following the release of the 2021 Census data. The Territory's estimated resident population as at 30 June 2021 was rebased from 245,909 to 249,200 (+3,291 persons).

The Territory's estimated resident population decreased by 0.2% (442 persons) to 249,345 persons in the December quarter 2021. Natural increase (+478 persons) and net overseas migration (+113 persons) contributed to growth while net interstate migration (-1,033 persons) detracted from growth. Nationally, population increased by 0.2%.

In annual terms, the Territory's population increased by 0.1%, while nationally, population increased by 0.5% (Chart 1). Annual population change in other jurisdictions ranged from a decrease of 0.1% in Victoria to an increase of 1.4% in Queensland (Chart 2).

#### Natural increase

In the December quarter 2021, the Territory recorded a positive natural increase of 478 persons, comprising 853 births and 375 deaths. In 2021, natural increase contributed 2,572 persons to the Territory's population, an increase of 1.0% compared to the previous year.

# Net interstate migration

Net interstate migration is being impacted by the ABS recently making COVID-19 related methodological adjustments to its treatment of Medicare source data.


In the December quarter 2021, net interstate migration detracted 1,033 persons from the population, a worsening on the net loss of 543 persons in the December quarter 2020. There were 4,841 arrivals to, and 5,874 departures from, the Territory in the quarter.

In 2021, net interstate migration detracted 3,420 persons from the population, a 104.9% worsening on the net loss of 1,669 persons in the previous year.


# Net overseas migration

In the December quarter 2021, net overseas migration contributed 113 persons to the population. Nationally, net overseas migration contributed 29,145 persons.

In 2021, net overseas migration in the Territory contributed 741 persons, an improvement compared to the net gain of 61 persons in the previous year (Chart 3). Nationally, net overseas migration detracted 3,598 persons.


