# Internet job vacancy report

#### February 2023 | Economic brief

The Commonwealth Jobs and Skills Australia (JSA) Vacancy Report is based on a count of newly lodged online job advertisements on a variety of job search websites. Unless stated otherwise, all data are reported in trend terms.

### Monthly change

In February 2023, the number of internet job vacancies in the Territory increased by 2.3% to 3,215. The largest increases were in the categories of 'professionals' (up by 3.7%) and 'community and personal services' (up by 3.6%), while the largest decreases were in the categories of 'labourers' (down by 2.3%) and 'sales' (down by 0.6%) (Chart 1).

The Territory reported the second largest increase of the jurisdictions, which ranged from a decrease of 0.9% in Victoria to an increase of 2.4% in Tasmania. Nationally, the number of job vacancies decreased by 0.1% to 276,510.

### Annual change

In annual terms, the number of job vacancies in the Territory increased by 7.4%. The largest increases were in the categories of 'community and personal services' (up by 24.2%) and 'professionals' (up by 21.3%), while the largest decreases were in the categories of 'sales' (down by 18.6%) and 'labourers' (down by 17.8%). The Territory reported the third largest increase of the jurisdictions, which ranged from a decrease of 4.9% in Victoria to an increase of 15.1% in Tasmania. Nationally, the number of vacancies increased by 0.4% (Chart 2).

## Regional vacancies (original)

JSA only reports regional vacancy data in original terms, which can be volatile on a month-to-month basis. The Department of Treasury and Finance aggregates the data to a three month moving average to smooth some of this volatility, though seasonal variations will remain.

In February 2023, the number of job vacancies in the Darwin region increased by 3.1% to 2,012 (compared with January 2023) (Chart 3), with 'clerical and administrative workers' (up by 7.9%) and 'machinery operators and drivers' (up by 7.5%) reporting the largest increases. In annual terms, Darwin job vacancies increased by 12.0%.


The number of vacancies across regional Northern Territory in the month increased by 4.7% to 858, with 'community and personal service workers' (up by 14.4%) and 'professionals' (up by 10.8%) reporting the largest increases. In annual terms, the number of regional job vacancies increased by 10.5%.

Chart 1: Internet job vacancies by industry




