

Fuel prices

June 2025 | Economic brief

The following information is sourced from the Australian Institute of Petroleum (AIP) and the Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (ACCC).

The reported monthly average price for June 2025 is calculated as the average price in cents per litre (cpl) for the four weeks ending 29 June 2025 unless otherwise stated.

Gross indicative retail differences (GIRDs) are the average retail price less the published terminal gate prices (TGP) and are used as an indication of gross retail margins.

The average retail price of ULP in the Territory was 192.5 cpl, 0.4 cpl lower than the previous month and 7.4 cpl lower over the year (Chart 1). Nationally, the average retail price of ULP was 178.3 cpl, 5.4 cpl higher than the previous month and 17.1 cpl lower over the year.

In Darwin, the average ULP price was 178.0 cpl, was unchanged compared to the previous month and 6.4 cpl lower over the year. This was the third highest retail price of the capital cities, which ranged from 171.7 cpl in Adelaide to 184.4 cpl in Melbourne (Chart 2).

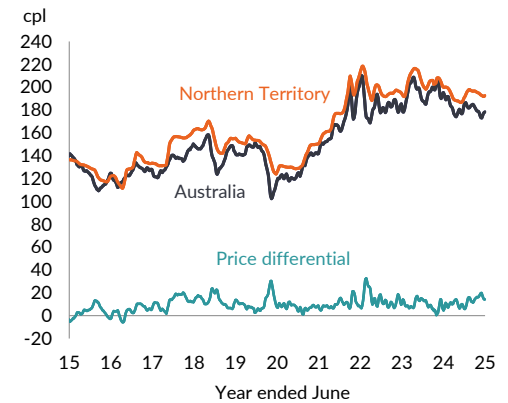
The average TGP for ULP in Darwin was 165.5 cpl, 4.5 cpl higher than the previous month and 9.1 cpl lower over the year. The average TGP nationally was 161.1 cpl, 4.6 cpl higher than the previous month and 10.3 cpl lower over the year.

The monthly average GIRD for ULP in Darwin declined by 4.5 cpl to 12.5 cpl (Chart 3). This was the fourth highest GIRD of the capital cities, which otherwise ranged from 9.8 cpl in Hobart to 23.2 cpl in Melbourne. The national average GIRD for ULP increased by 0.8 cpl to 17.2 cpl in the month

ACCC fuel price monitoring

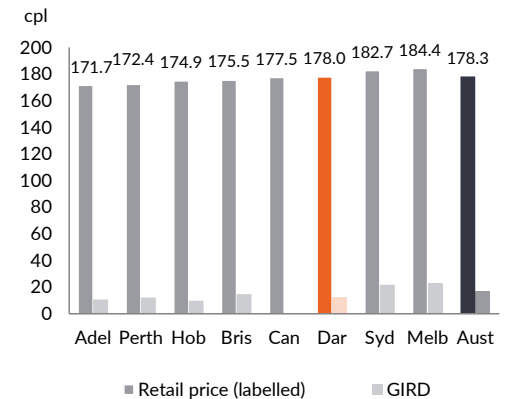
The ACCC released its Report on the Australian Petroleum Market for the March quarter 2025 on 3 June 2025. The Report can be accessed [here](#). The Report shows that the Darwin average ULP price was 181.4 cpl, 0.8 cpl lower than the average of the five largest capital cities (Sydney, Melbourne, Brisbane, Adelaide and Perth).

Chart 1: Retail unleaded petrol price (monthly average)



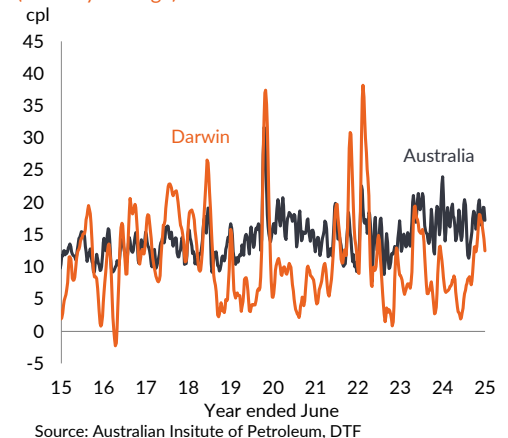

Diesel

The monthly average retail price of diesel across the Territory was 204.5 cpl. This was an increase of 0.1 cpl from the previous month and 7.5 cpl lower over the year (Chart 4). The monthly average retail diesel price across Australia was 180.1 cpl, an increase of 0.9 cpl from the previous month and 13.0 cpl lower over the year.

Darwin recorded a monthly average retail diesel price of 182.2 cpl, 3.0 cpl higher than the previous month and 5.7 cpl lower over the year. Darwin had the second highest retail price of the capital cities, which ranged from 173.1 cpl in Adelaide to 189.9 cpl in Canberra (Chart 5).

The TGP for diesel in Darwin was 168.1 cpl, 5.3 cpl higher than last month and 11.2 cpl lower over the year. Darwin's average GIRD for diesel declined by 2.2 cpl to 14.1 cpl (Chart 6). This was the third highest of the capital cities, which otherwise ranged from 9.4 cpl in Adelaide to 15.6 cpl in Brisbane.

Brent crude oil

The monthly average spot price of Brent crude oil in June 2025 was \$106.92 per barrel in Australian dollar terms (Chart 7). This was an increase of 7.7% in the month and a decline of 14.0% over the year.

Chart 7: Brent crude oil prices (monthly average)

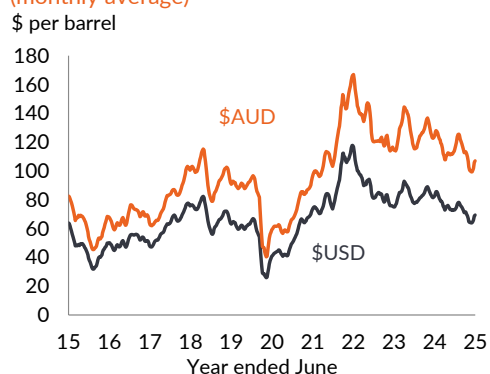


Chart 4: Retail diesel price (monthly average)

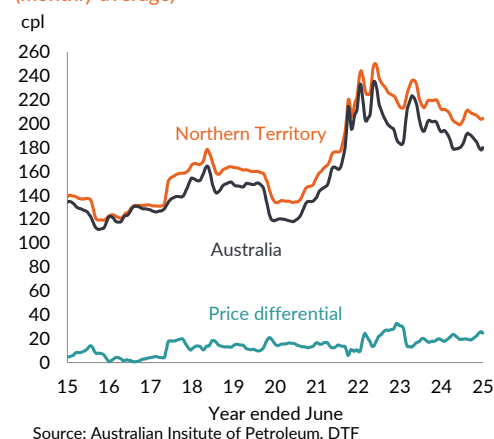


Chart 5: Diesel price and gross indicative retail difference (monthly average)

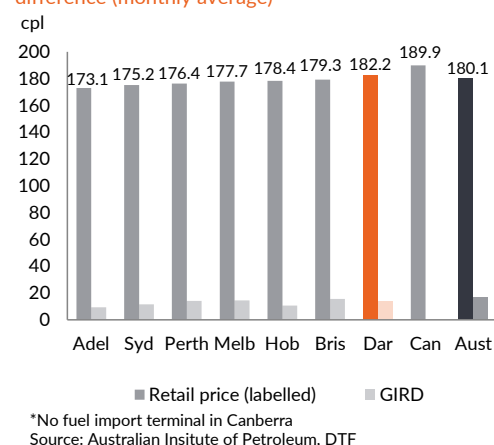


Chart 6: Diesel gross indicative retail difference (monthly average)

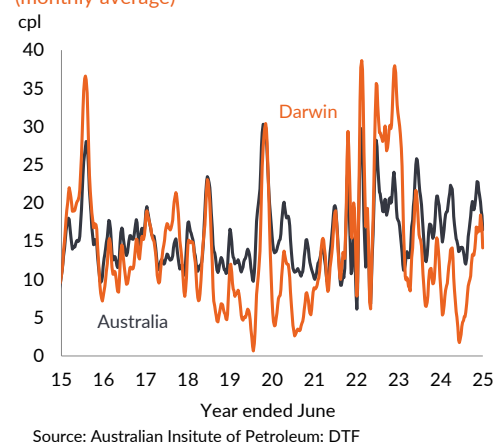

3 Terminal gate prices (TGPs) are the published daily spot prices at which fuel can be purchased from the fuel import or refinery terminal and provide an indication of the actual wholesale price of fuel. The largest component of the TGP is the price of crude oil, followed by the Commonwealth Government's fuel excise and goods and services tax.

4 Gross indicative retail differences (GIRD) are equal to the monthly average retail price less the monthly average TGP and are used as a broad indication of gross retail fuel margins.

* AIP does not report on diesel prices for Alice Springs, Katherine and Tennant Creek.

Term	Definition
Gross Indicative Retail Differences (GIRDs)	Gross indicative retail differences are the average retail price less the published terminal gate prices and are used as an indication of gross retail margins.
Terminal Gate Price (TGP)	Terminal gate price is the wholesale price for the bulk supply of a petroleum product.
